Brief CV: Eleni Sarlani, DDS, PhD holds a dental degree from the University of Athens, Greece (1996), and a Certificate in Orofacial Pain (2001) and PhD in Neuroscience (2003) from the University of Maryland, Baltimore. She became a Diplomate of the American Board of Orofacial Pain in 2002. She is member of various European, American and International scientific societies of Pain, Oral Medicine, and Neuroscience. She is currently an Assistant Professor in the department of Comprehensive Care and Therapeutics, and the department of Biomedical Sciences (Neuroscience Track), Baltimore College of Dental Surgery, where she participates in the teaching of undergraduate and postgraduate students. She is also the Co-director of the Brotman Facial Pain Center at the Baltimore College of Dental Surgery, where she diagnoses and manages patients with various types of orofacial pain. She has more than 40 scientific publications and presentations on topics related to Orofacial Pain. Her current areas of research focus on the neural mechanisms underlying 1) the

development of chronic facial pain, and 2) the greater female prevalence of various chronic pain conditions. Her studies utilize psychophysical methods to examine the sensitivity of healthy males and females, as well as of chronic facial pain patients to experimental pain.
